
Interprofessional collaboration




Interprofessional health-care teams understand how to optimize the skills of their members, share case management and provide better health-services to patients and the community.

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- Members of different profession groups work together
- The roles of those involved are clarified together
- Some tasks can be shared
- Patients are involved
- The collaboration leads to results that no professional group could have achieved on its own.



Interaction of patient with a team member





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


HCV care cascade

Nurse-led model of HCV care




- Involvement of qualified and experienced hepatology nurses in clinical management

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Nurse-led model of HCV treatment care







Make every contact count - teachable moments in clinical practice





- 1. Address adverse behaviour, problematic lifestyle and show interest in patient's individual concern
- 2. Use patient-centred communication to explore patient's motivation (and skills) for behaviour change
- 3. Make an agreement with the patient

Take Home Message



- Interprofessional collaboration in hepatitis C care is possible.
- Roles with tasks and processes have to be clarified.
- We learn with, from and about all team members.
- Specialised nurses ensure that patients needs are recognized and provide patient care and management appropriately.
